FINANCIAL AID OPPORTUNITIES for the 2017-2018 School Year

Two types of financial aid are available to those families who demonstrate financial need.

<u>Children's Scholarship Fund</u> has money available to help pay student tuition. If you meet the guidelines below, I urge you to submit an online application at <u>www.csfomaha.org</u>. The applications of those qualifying families who apply are chosen by financial need priority. The scholarships are available for students who will be in Kindergarten through 8th grade. Complete applications are due April 28. The income guidelines for NEW applicants are:

The class then took photos of the pages in their books, edited the photos, and then made their own digital version of the story on an app called *Book Creator*. The completed project included their voices after they recorded themselves reading their story.
