Dear Parents and Guardians:

"From the first centuries after Christ, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered saints, who live in God's presence forever. Every year, on the anniversary of the martyrs' deaths, Christians would visit their tombs and celebrate the Eucharist. This practice grew throughout the centuries to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. Soon the entire calendar was filled with memorials of the saints. In the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence.

One of the great gifts of our Catholic tradition is remembrance of and prayer with the saints. The Church offers us an official canon, or list, of saints. On All Saints Day, November 1, we recall and pray with these saints. It is important to continue to tell these stories of saints and saintly people to our children so that they have ample models of people of faith for their own lives.

Children today are in search of role models. Popular television and movie stars, sports figures, and others from pop culture (have you heard "I wanna be YouTube famous"?!) are often idolized and emulated. Our Catholic tradition also offers a rich history of people who provide models for Christian living. More than role models, however, the tradition of the Communion of Saints provides basis for connection and real relationship with those who have gone before us in the faith. This tradition can capture the imagination of our young people and foster their maturation as Christian disciples.

Together as a family, name and tell the story of favorite saints. Together prepare a list of some of the traits that these people have in common (generosity, courage, prayerfulness, and so on). After preparing this list, read together the Gospel for All Saints Day, Matthew 5:1-12. Identify how the attitudes described in the Beatitudes are reflected in the lives of the saints and people you named.

Pray together as a family a Litany of the Saints (For example, you could pray, 'St. Elizabeth' and your children respond, 'Pray for us.') Include in your list the saints and holy people you named in your discussion above. Conclude by praying that your family will follow the example of these

people as disciples of Jesus" (Excerpts above taken from <u>loyolapress.com/our-catholic-faith/saints</u>).

"Remember that when Catholics say we are 'praying' to a saint, what we mean is that we are asking that saint to ask God for something on our behalf. We are not worshipping the saint as a god or instead of God. The word 'pray' comes from the Latin *precari*, 'to ask earnestly, beg, entreat.' We can 'pray' as in 'ask earnestly' and expect that the saints will intercede for us with God, whom they now see face-to-face" (Tierney, Kendra. *The Catholic All Year Compendium: Liturgical Living For Real Life*. Weather Reminders

NO SCHOOL - All classes, after school activities, and sport practices are cancelled for the day. The St. Cecilia Cathedral Child Care will also be closed. If your child has a sporting event scheduled on the night of a cancelled day of school (i.e., basketball game), you will need to be in communication with your son/daughter's coach to see if the game is also cancelled.

2-HOUR LATE START - This is a new policy that Omaha Public Schools (OPS) and therefore Omaha Catholic Schools are implementing this year. If you see the announcement of "Omaha Catholic Schools - 2 HOUR LATE START," then all classes (PreK-8th grade) will start at 10:00 AM. This means that drop off begins at 9:45 AM. The Child Care Center would also be opening at 10:00 AM.

This new 2-hour late start will have some bugs that we'll have to work out as we go. We will still be ordering lunch from Westside but we have been told that it may affect the lunch times a bit. As soon as we experience and go through the process, I'll communicate how lunch times will work on those late start days.

We have also been informed that OPS *may* utilize an early release schedule in the event that an impending weather event might compromise safe travel. We WILL NOT be following that announcement so if you feel as though you need to pick your child up early from school, we support that decision.
